Cegelec signs several contracts for transport systems in France, Austria, Hungary and Morocco

Paris, 29 October 2008

Cegelec, an international group providing technological services to companies and public authorities, signed several new contracts in recent months in France, Austria, Hungary and Morocco, totalling over 30 million euros.

Contracts include the electrification of the 18 km long, first tramway line in Rabat, the ventilation and smoke exhaust systems for the future Metro 4 underground line in Budapest, and the traction system for 25 new trolleybuses for the city of Salzburg. Cegelec also won the contract for the provision of the ERTMS-enabled wireless telecom infrastructure, Europe's future unique signalling standard for the rail industry, for the high-speed Rhin- Rhône line in France, and another one for the rehabilitation of catenaries in Bordeaux.

In addition, Cegelec played an active role in the new automatic metro project in Lausanne, inaugurated at the end of September. The century-old M2 metro line was replaced by a much longer fully automated line, for which Cegelec contributed in the areas of security, access control, fire detection and ventilation.

Cegelec designs comprehensive service offers for the transport industry, comprising engineering, execution and maintenance of urban and railway infrastructures in Europe and around the world. It develops innovative solutions, notably in the fields of electrification (catenaries and sub-stations), signalling, wheel set axle inspection system and peripheral equipment particularly for metro tunnels and stations.
